MESSAGE FROM MRS FORD, HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents/Carers

I am very pleased to welcome you back to a new school year. I hope that you all had a wonderful summer. I am also very pleased to welcome our new children and their families to Stepgates this term. The children have settled very well with their new class teachers and I am looking forward to a happy and successful year working together. I would like to thank you for your continuing support, which makes all the difference to your child's education at Stepgates.

Firstly, I would like to extend a huge thank you on behalf of the staff at Stepgates for all the cards and gifts we received at the end of term. It is always sad to see the children we have worked closely with moving up to a new class or school but it is good to know that they have such happy memories to take with them as they grow up.

I hope that you will take the opportunity to meet with your child's new class teacher at their 'Meet the Teacher' meetings (date and time for each class has been advised separately), as these meetings contain useful information which we hope will help with your child's transition; however there will be another opportunity to meet your child's class teacher later this term on Tuesday 10th October for Parent-Teacher Consultation Evening.

SOCIAL MEDIA REMINDER

As we start the new academic year I would like to remind parents of our Social Media Policy, in particular around WhatsApp groups. If you have any worries or concerns around school practices or procedures please speak to a member of staff in school. This enables issues to be dealt with swiftly and appropriately. WhatsApp groups are not designed for this purpose.

Please see below for guidelines around Stepgates Community School Social Media Policy:

The school encourages all members of the community in the same responsible and respectful use of social media that is taught to pupils. All matters regarding the school are to be communicated via appropriate channels so that they may be dealt with fairly and effectively for all concerned. Parents/carers are reminded to use existing structures when making any complaint about the school or a member of staff. If at any time during the child's time at Stepgates Community school, a parent wish to make a complaint, then they are advised to follow the school's Complaint Policy and Procedure which can be found on the school website. We recommend that all parents and carers refrain from using social networking sites to discuss sensitive issues about the school.

Abusive, libellous or defamatory comments on social media (including WhatApp Groups etc.) regarding the school, staff or pupils will be reported to the site's 'report abuse' section, or School's Admin Team, for immediate removal. Procedures on how the school will deal with such issues are outlined in The School's Social Media Policy, Appendix A: What to do if a complaint is made on Social Networking by a Parent or Carer.

ATTENDANCE / PUNCTUALITY EXPECTATIONS

ABSENCE & HOLIDAY REQUESTS

As we start the new academic year, I would like to remind parents of my expectations regarding absence and holiday requests. The Head Teacher, on behalf of the Governing Body, can grant leave, at their discretion, for up to five days in any school year in EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES. (Please note - A 'Family Holiday' does not meet the criteria for 'exceptional circumstances'). This includes leaving school early. In accordance with guidance from Surrey County Council no holidays will be authorised at the beginning of the academic year, or during May due to end of year assessments. No parents/carers can demand leave of absence for their children as a right. Holidays taken without the permission of the Governing Body may result in legal action being taken against each parent.

As a school we are obliged to inform you that you may be subject to a Penalty Notice if your child's absence from school is unauthorised. It is important your child attends school to get a good education. **By law**, as a parent or carer, you must make sure that if your child is aged 5 to 16 (compulsory school age), he or she receives a suitable full-time education. This means that your child should not have sessions of unauthorised absence. During term time your child should attend school regularly unless he or she is ill or the school has authorised their absence.

The Penalty Notice fine would be :-

- \cdot £60 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days, rising to
- ·£120 per parent, per child if paid between 21-28 days.
- \cdot If the fine is not paid within 28 days you may be prosecuted under 5444.1 of the Education Act 1996.

I must advise you that if the prosecution takes place, the maximum fine is £1,000 per parent, per child. This reflects the seriousness of unauthorised absence from school.

Our inclusion Officer also expects school to provide evidence of illness if attendance is below 90%.

Our key priority is to ensure your child(ren) are as successful as possible, are able to reach his/her full potential and gains maximum benefits from his/her educational experience.

I would hope that upon reflection you are able to support this decision in line with the Local Authority and Government policy, that leave should be restricted to the 13 weeks school holidays except in exceptional circumstances.

PUNCTUALITY

I would also like to remind parents that lateness to school is just as serious as non-attendance and could also lead to a Fixed Penalty Notice. It is expected that children will arrive at school on time. The start of the school day is an important time for children to develop their social skills with their peers, as well as preparing them for their learning. We start teaching at 8.45am and 'late' children miss out on vital skills such as phonics and/or basic number work. In cases of persistent late arrival to school, school will liaise with the parents/carers to identify reasons for the persistent lateness and provide appropriate support and guidance. The matter may be referred to the Inclusion Officer (IO) for investigation on her regular visits to school. The role of the Inclusion Service is to monitor school attendance/lateness and to support children in order to improve their attendance/lateness. This often involves a home visit.

Thank you for your support in ensuring all our children are in school on time, every day.

ARTIST OF THE MONTH



Dame Phyllida Barlow DBE RA

(Born 4th April 1944)

Dame Phyllida Barlow DBE RA is a British artist. Barlow studied at Chelsea College of Art (1960–63) and the Slade School of Art

(1963–66). After joining the staff in the late 1960s, Barlow taught at the Slade School of Art for more than forty years before retiring in 2009 and is now Emerita Professor of Fine Art. Phyllida Barlow has had an important influence on younger generations of artists through her work and long teaching career in London art schools. At the Slade School of Fine Art, her students included Turner Prize-winning and nominated artists Rachel Whiteread and Angela de la Cruz. In 2017, Barlow represented Great Britain at the Venice Biennale.

COMPOSER OF THE MONTH



John Williams

(Born 8th February 1932)

John Towner Williams is an American composer, conductor, pianist and trombonist. In a career that has spanned nearly seven decades, he has composed some of the most popular, recognizable, and critically acclaimed film scores in cinematic history. Williams has won 25 Grammy Awards, seven British Academy Film Awards, five Academy Awards, and four Golden Globe Awards. With 52 Academy Award nominations, he is the second most-nominated individual, after Walt Disney. His compositions are considered the epitome of film music. In 2005, the American Film Institute selected Williams's score to 1977's Star Wars as the greatest film score of all time. The Library of Congress also entered the Star Wars soundtrack into the National Recording Registry for being "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant".
