MESSAGE FROM MRS FORD, HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back to a new term, it doesn't seem possible it's the Summer term already. I hope you all had a very enjoyable holiday.

On Thursday 20th April we had a very successful whole school trip to Windsor Castle; this was a fantastic trip, rearranged from September, and was thoroughly enjoyed by the staff and children. I would like to say a huge thank you to all parents/carers who offered their help on the day and to the children, who were outstanding ambassadors for the school during the trip; their behaviour was exemplary!

We have a very busy term ahead with many exciting activities arranged; our wonderful FOSS Team are already in the process of organising their very popular Summer Fair. Further details of this will follow in due course.

We are almost in May with SATs tests for Year 6 starting the week beginning Tuesday 9^{th} May. (School will be closed on Monday 8th May which is a Bank Holiday to Celebrate the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III). Year 2 will also be sitting their SATs tests during May and assessments will be taking place in all year groups. PLEASE make sure your child is in school every day so they do not miss any preparation work or tests.

ABSENCE & HOLIDAY REQUESTS

As we start the Summer term, I thought I would take the opportunity to remind parents of my expectations regarding absence and holiday requests. The Head Teacher, on behalf of the Governing Body, can grant leave, at their discretion, for up to <u>5 days in any school year in EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES</u>. (Please note - A 'Family Holiday' does not meet the criteria for 'exceptional circumstances'). This includes leaving school early.

In accordance with guidance from Surrey County Council no holidays will be authorised at the beginning of the academic year, or during May due to end of year assessments. No parents/carers can demand leave of absence for their children as a right. Holidays taken without the permission of the Governing Body may result in legal action being taken against each parent.

Whilst the school will grant requests for absence for dental and medical treatments, parents/carers are encouraged, whenever possible, to book dental and medical appointments outside of the school day. When appointments during the school day are unavoidable, the school office should be notified in advance in writing, of the date and time of the appointment and when the child will be collected and/or returned to school. Evidence of the appointment should be provided.

ATTENDANCE

Well done to the 68 children who achieved 100% attendance for the Spring term.

All parents will shortly be receiving a Red, Amber or Green Attendance letter for your child based on their attendance last term. Individual attendance for a child should be at least 95%; anything above this generates a 'Green' letter. Attendance below 90% generates a 'Red' letter as this is well below what is expected, and attendance between 90% and 95% generates an 'Amber' letter. These figures do not relate to whether the absences are authorised or not, they are based on overall attendance for the term.

Please see Page 2 of this newsletter for further attendance information, including calculations for lost learning due to lateness to school. I would like to remind parents that lateness to school is just as serious as non-attendance and could also lead to a Fixed Penalty Notice. It is expected that children will arrive at school on time. The start of the school day is an important time for children to develop their social skills with their peers, as well as preparing them for their learning. We start teaching at 8.50am and 'late' children miss out on vital skills such as phonics and/or basic number work. In cases of persistent late arrival to school, school will liaise with the parents/carers to identify reasons for the persistent lateness and provide appropriate support and guidance. The matter may be referred to the Inclusion Officer (IO) for investigation on her regular visits to school. The role of the Inclusion Service is to monitor school attendance/lateness and to support children in order to improve their attendance/lateness. This often involves a home visit.

Thank you for your support in ensuring all our children are in school on time, every day.

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

He has received a number of awards, including a knighthood in 1992, followed by a peerage from Queen Elizabeth II for services to the Arts.
