#### MESSAGE FROM MRS FORD, HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents/Carers

We have had a busy half term in school with many things to celebrate, including sporting successes, exciting school trips, and most of all fantastic learning.

#### OFSTED

I would like to thank my wonderful staff and our amazing children for their hard work during our Ofsted Inspection last week. I would also like to thank all parents/carers and Governors for your support and the contributions you made to the Inspection.

Our Ofsted Report now needs to be written and will then go through a process to be quality assured which, whilst extremely unlikely, can sometimes change the judgements made. As a result, the full report will not be available to parents until September.

The Ofsted Inspectors were very complimentary about Stepgates Community School and we are very pleased with the feedback we received. I am enormously proud of the staff and children, who were wonderful ambassadors for the school.

A huge thank you must go to our FOSS members who worked tirelessly organising the Summer Fair. Once again, this was very well attended and enjoyed by all. A huge thank you too, to the Mayor of Runnymede for 2023-24, Cllr Saise-Marshall, for attending this event.

I would also like to say thank you to all parents/carers who supported Sports Day yesterday.

On Tuesday 27th June the children were able to visit their new classroom and spend an afternoon with their new class teacher, as part of our transition for their move up to the next year group in September. This was a very exciting afternoon for the children, who all enjoyed finding out a little more about the things they will be learning in the next school year.

Transition visits for the new Reception and Nursery children have also taken place and were very successful. We look forward to welcoming all the new starters in September.

Year 6 have been making their preparations for moving on to their new secondary schools and on Monday 10th July they will present their end of term production Star Warts: The Umpire Strikes Back.

We still have a range of exciting activities to enjoy before the end of term, including our 'Big Splash Week' from Monday 3rd to Friday 7th July. On Saturday 8th July we will be taking part in the Black Cherry Fair Parade. As we did last year, we are planning to shine within our community by creating a simple walking procession. Dance Club will also be performing two dances in the main arena at the Black Cherry Fair at approximately 12:30pm, and many of our own pupils will be performing with their own external clubs.

#### SAFE PARKING REMINDER

I fully appreciate how difficult it can be to park near the school when picking up and dropping off your children, however, can I ask parents to show consideration to the residents of Stepgates by not parking across driveways, the school's electronic gates or on the yellow 'keep clear' zig zag road markings. Please can I also ask you to take care with your speed when pulling in to park, pulling out or driving along Stepgates. It is dangerous and makes crossing the road unsafe for our children, as well as being very irritating for our neighbours. If you or your child has difficulty accessing the school then you are welcome to park directly outside the school entrance with your 'Disability Badge'. Thank you in advance for your consideration and safe parking.

#### ABSENCE & HOLIDAY REQUESTS

As of September 2023 (Autumn term), I would like to inform parents of my expectations regarding absence and holiday requests. The Head Teacher, on behalf of the Governing Body, can grant leave, at their discretion, for up to five days in any school year in EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES. (Please note - A 'Family Holiday' does not meet the criteria for 'exceptional circumstances'). This includes leaving school early. In accordance with guidance from Surrey County Council no holidays will be authorised at the beginning of the academic year, or during May due to end of year assessments. No parents/carers can demand leave of absence for their children as a right. Holidays taken without the permission of the Governing Body may result in legal action being taken against each parent.

As a school we are obliged to inform you that you may be subject to a Penalty Notice if your child's absence from school is unauthorised. It is important your child attends school to get a good education. **By law**, as a parent or carer, you must make sure that if your child is aged 5 to 16 (compulsory school age), he or she receives a suitable full-time education. This means that your child should not have sessions of unauthorised absence. During term time your child should attend school regularly unless he or she is ill or the school has authorised their absence.

The Penalty Notice fine would be :-

- ·£60 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days, rising to
- £120 per parent, per child if paid between 21-28 days.

· If the fine is not paid within 28 days you may be prosecuted under 5444.1 of the Education Act 1996.

I must advise you that if the prosecution takes place, the maximum fine is  $\pounds$ 1,000 per parent, per child. This reflects the seriousness of unauthorised absence from school.

Our inclusion Officer also expects school to provide evidence of illness if attendance is below 90%.

Our key priority is to ensure your child(ren) are as successful as possible, are able to reach his/her full potential and gains maximum benefits from his/her educational experience.

I would hope that upon reflection you are able to support this decision in line with the Local Authority and Government policy, that leave should be restricted to the 13 weeks school holidays except in exceptional circumstances.

#### REMINDERS

Finally, please could I ask all parents/carers to ensure your children are supervised at all times during 'pick-up' and 'drop-off' - siblings and all children, once collected, should remain in your care at all times. Please also don't forget bikes and scooters are not permitted on the school grounds.

As always, thank you for your continued support and generosity.

## **RNLI VISIT**

On Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> June we welcomed Colin Brown from the RNLI into our school to talk about Water Safety both at the beach and in rivers and lakes.

The children were amazing and listened so well. They learnt how to call for help when in the sea and practiced putting their hand (squeezed fist) up in the air whilst shouting help. They learnt about the importance of floating if you fall in the water and that after 90 seconds, once calm calling for help or swimming to safety.

We had two children who dressed as lifeguards and held up different beach flags to reinforce which flags you can swim between. We found out about inflatables that drift out to sea and that an orange windsock warns against using inflatables when strong winds are blowing out to sea.

If paddle boarding they reinforced the importance of parents having their phones charged and in a waterproof case to be able to call for help.

We watched a video about a life boat named 'Shannon' and discussed that the crew have other jobs and volunteer their time. If you want to find out more RNLI.org has lots of information.

Flags: If the beach you're at is not lifeguarded, please take extra care if you are going into the water. If lifeguards are on patrol, then you'll need to know your flags.				
Beach flags				
	Red and yellow beach flag			
	Lifeguard-patrolled swimming and body boarding zone or lifeguard on duty. This shows the lifeguarded area and is the safest place to swim and bodyboard			
	Black and white chequered beach flag			
	Surfboard and other water craft zone or zone boundary. For surfboards, stand-up paddleboards, kayaks and other non-powered craft. Launch and recovery area for kite surfers and windsurfers. Never swim or bodyboard here.			
	Red beach flag			
	Dangerous conditions: do not enter the water. Signifies a severe hazard, that water conditions are unsafe for swimming and other water activities, and people should not enter the water.			
STOLUTIANABLES	Orange windsock			
	Danger: no inflatables to be used on the water. Indicates offshore or strong wind conditions. Never use inflatables when the windsock is flying.			

In addition to lessons in schools and outside speakers such as the RNLI we try to signpost opportunities in the local area.

Surrey Fire and Rescue service are holding a Water Safety Event 'Walton Water Safety Day' on Saturday 22nd July from 10am to 4pm at Cowey Sale, under Walton Bridge, Walton.
