

Sheila Hicks is an American artist and was born in Hastings, Nebraska. She is known for her innovative and experimental weavings and sculptural textile art that incorporate distinctive colours, natural materials, and personal narratives.

Since 1964, she lives and works in Paris, France. Prior to that, she lived and worked in Guerrero, Mexico from 1959 to 1963.

Jamie Cullum is an English jazz-pop singersongwriter and radio presenter. Although primarily a vocalist and pianist, he also accompanies himself on other instruments, including guitar and drums. He has recorded nine studio albums, three compilation albums, one live album and twentyfour singles. Since April 2010, he has presented a weekly Tuesday evening jazz show on BBC Radio 2.




