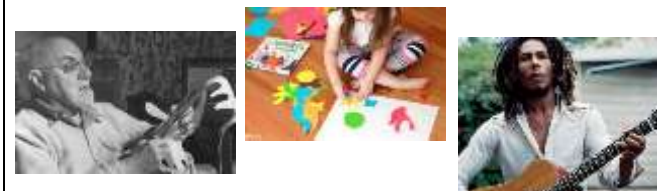
Choose the Autumn fruit. Cook with a grown-up, helping with measuring and preparing.
