National Early Years Foundation Stage, Key Stage 1 and 2 Data for 2022

Here is the attainment and progress data for our school at the end of the Early Years Foundation Stage, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2. Some children enter school at levels below Surrey and national expected levels of development. We are an inclusive school where all children are valued and provided with an appropriate curriculum across the full ability range. As a community we believe that data alone does not reflect the full picture of what Stepgates Community School provides for our children. All children must have access to an education that challenges, extends and moves them forward personally, academically, socially, and emotionally. End of Early Years Foundation Stage July 2022

The Early Years Foundation Stage Profile (EYFSP) is a teacher assessment of children's development at the end of the EYFS (the end of the academic year in which the child turns five). It supports a smooth transition to Key Stage 1 (KS1) by informing the professional dialogue between EYFS and KS1 teachers. This information should help Year 1 teachers plan an effective, responsive and appropriate curriculum that will meet the needs of all children. The Profile is also designed to inform parents or carers about their child's development against the Early Learning Goals. The Profile has an emphasis on the three prime areas which are most essential for children's healthy development: communication and language; physical; and personal, social and emotional development. Practitioners make a best-fit assessment of whether children are emerging, expected or exceeding against each of the 17 Early Learning Goals (ELGs) which are divided into 7 areas of learning. Children achieving a 'Good level of development' are those achieving at least the expected level within the following areas of learning: communication and language; physical development; and personal, social and emotional development; literacy; and mathematics.

Phonics Screening 2022

Children at the end of year 1 take part in Phonics Screening. Children in Year 1 carried out the statutory phonic screening test in June. The children have to achieve a score of 32 in order to achieve the pass for the phonics screening. The results for this year are as follows in comparison to national data.

End of Key Stage 1 July 2022

Children at the end of Year 2 (aged 6-7) take part in national standardised tests known as the end of Key Stage 1 SATs. Children at this stage of school are expected to achieve Age Related Expectations (ARE) for Year 2 in Reading, Writing, Maths and Science. Some children who are more able and working beyond the Year 2 expectations will be identified as achieving above Age Related Expectations (ARE).

Pupils are assessed against a more challenging curriculum, which was introduced in 2014. Results are no longer reported as levels, the interim frameworks for teacher assessment have been used by teachers to assess if a pupil has met the new, higher expected standard. The expectations for pupils at the end of key stage 1 have been raised.

End of Key Stage 2 Results July 2022

Children at the end of Year 6 (aged 10-11) take part in national standardised tests known as the end of Key Stage 2 SATs.

In 2022 the national curriculum was assessed by tests and interim frameworks for teacher assessment like in 2018. Children at this stage of school were expected to achieve Age Related Expectations (ARE) for Year 6 in English, Maths and Science. Some children who were more able and working beyond the Year 6 expectations would be identified as achieving above Age Related Expectations (ARE).

The expectations for pupils at the end of key stage 2 have been raised. Given the differences from previous years to the curriculum and assessments, levels are not comparable with scaled scores or teacher assessment outcomes.

Under the Ofsted Inspection Framework there is a strong emphasis on the progress that has been made from the end of EYFS and KS1 to the end of KS2, as well as attainment.
